6-1-1 : GENERAL STATEMENT

The City of Tetonia public parks are utilized by the general population and specific groups; therefore, terms and conditions regulating the use of city parks will promote the public health, safety and welfare, and whereas the city parks are maintained by the city, additional revenue for upkeep and maintenance of city parks is necessary.

6-1-2 : CITY PARKS

A. Regulations:

1. The park shall be vacated between the hours of 11 :00 PM and sunrise Sunday through Thursday and by midnight on Friday and Saturday.
2. Events of a commercial nature where goods or services are exchanged or sold, or vending of food or refreshments, shall require a license under Title 2 Chapter 3 of the City of Tetonia Code.
3. Patrons shall report any damage of park facilities to the city clerk or public works director at city hall.
4. It is the responsibility of patrons to clean up the areas used in the park following an event, including, but not limited to placing paper and other disposable items in trash receptacles.
5. No overnight camping shall be allowed in a city park.
6. No golf equipment shall be used in a city park.

B. City Park Permit: Reservation of a city park requires submission of an application provided by the city and approval of a park permit.

1. Reservation of a city park shall be administered by the city clerk.
2. A city park may be reserved for up to three consecutive days or throughout a single sport season within an eight week period.
3. The park is reserved on a first come first served basis.
4. A reserved event shall have priority over general use by the public.

C. City Park Fees: City park fees shall be established by resolution of the city council. Park fees are nonrefundable. (Ord. 2008-2)

6-1-3: PENALTY

- A. Anyone who remains or enters upon park property after eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. or midnight on Friday and Saturday and prior to sunrise shall be guilty of an infraction for the first violation with a twenty five dollar (\$25.00) penalty, an infraction for the second violation with a fifty dollar (\$50.00) penalty, and misdemeanor for the third and subsequent violations within a calendar year, and punished as set forth in section 1-4-1 of this Code.
